COMMON ASSESSMENT TASKS (CATS) YEARS 7, 8, 9 AND 10

Each term students are taught the key content and skills from the Victorian Curriculum Standards.

The Common Assessment Task [CAT] and associated assessment period is an important part of each student's learning and as such, it is vital that all students are present. We value the information we gain from the CATs which are used to measure the students' learning and growth achieved against the standard.

What is a Common Assessment Task?

A Common Assessment Task is the final assessment that is delivered at the end of the unit of work in each study area.

What is the purpose of a Common Assessment Task?

- A Common Assessment Task is designed to measure student achievement against the standard and the key skills that come from that standard
- CATs are an opportunity for students to show how much they have learnt and demonstrate their growth in skills
- CATs are used by teachers to report student outcomes, measure growth and inform future planning for learning for each child
- CATs acknowledge, recognise and celebrate student achievement

When do students do CATs?

- In term 2, students will undertake CATs over 2 weeks from June 11th to June 20th.
- CATs will be competed in class time
- Please note that Monday the 10th of June is the King's birthday holiday and Friday the 21st of June is a college wide Curriculum Day.

Note: Some classes may deviate slightly from this timeframe.

When completing CATs, students have access to all relevant tools to help them to complete a CAT successfully and demonstrate their skill level.

What can you do to support your son/daughter during the CAT period?

- Encourage and strive for 100% attendance
 - your child needs to be present for every CAT to receive an assessment result
- Check in with him/her to see how they are coping and be mindful of the work they are undertaking in their classes
- Keep him/her healthy
 - appropriate amounts of sleep
 - healthy food and exercise
- Remind him/her that they can ask for support from the teachers
- Remind him/her that CATs are part of the learning program and not 'extra work'
- Remind him/her that everything they are asked to do in a CAT, is based on what they have learnt in class
- Remind him/her that CATs are a way to measure their growth and achievement
- Remind him/her that CATs are a way to recognise and celebrate their learning

What happens if my child misses the assessment period?

If students are absent for any of the sessions dedicated to the CAT, they will be required to catch up when they return to school. If the student is absent for the whole assessment period, it may be necessary to dedicate after school catch up sessions in the weeks after the CAT.

Fountain Gate Secondary College asks for your co-operation in this process, and this means sending your child to school during this time. If your child is too ill to attend, please contact the school and alternative CAT arrangements will be made if practical. At a minimum, your child will be asked to catch up in the allocated class time when they return.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day. Attending and participating in school will help your child develop:

- important skills and knowledge to help them learn
- social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and team work.

Children who attend school every day and complete year 12 have:

- better health
- better job opportunities
- higher income across their lives.

There is no safe number of days for missing school. Each day a student misses puts them behind.

Last year, our students were each absent for an average of 29.6 days. This means they missed, on average, almost 6 weeks of school. It will be difficult for any student to achieve their best when they have so many interruptions to their learning. Our goal for 2024 is to decrease this number. So far, we're on-track for a slight decrease to 29.1 days, however we want to see this improve further.

We ask that families ensure students arrive at school between 8:00 and 8:35 am and attend every day instruction is given.

Each week, Year 7 & 8 students will participate in a new activity that aligns with our school's values and character strengths.



















SOCIT Presentation:














Creating worlds where passions can be explored.
